CONTEXT

The meeting aims to provide an opportunity to reflect on the state of play of European vocational education and training policies as we are reaching a new decade, with special attention focused on the future agenda for adult learning. We will consider the appropriate steps to enhance and implement the objectives of the Recommendation on VET, which together with the Osnabrück Declaration, supports the creation of a lifelong learning culture with continuous VET and digitalisation at its core. We aim to dive deeper into several aspects to ensure that VET and Adult Learning become more agile for better work and life. In this context, we will have the opportunity to exchange ideas on the reform-related increasing need for continuous learning in transforming societies, discuss ways to enhance efficient and effective investments in people and explore possibilities for additional development of VET and Adult Learning.
